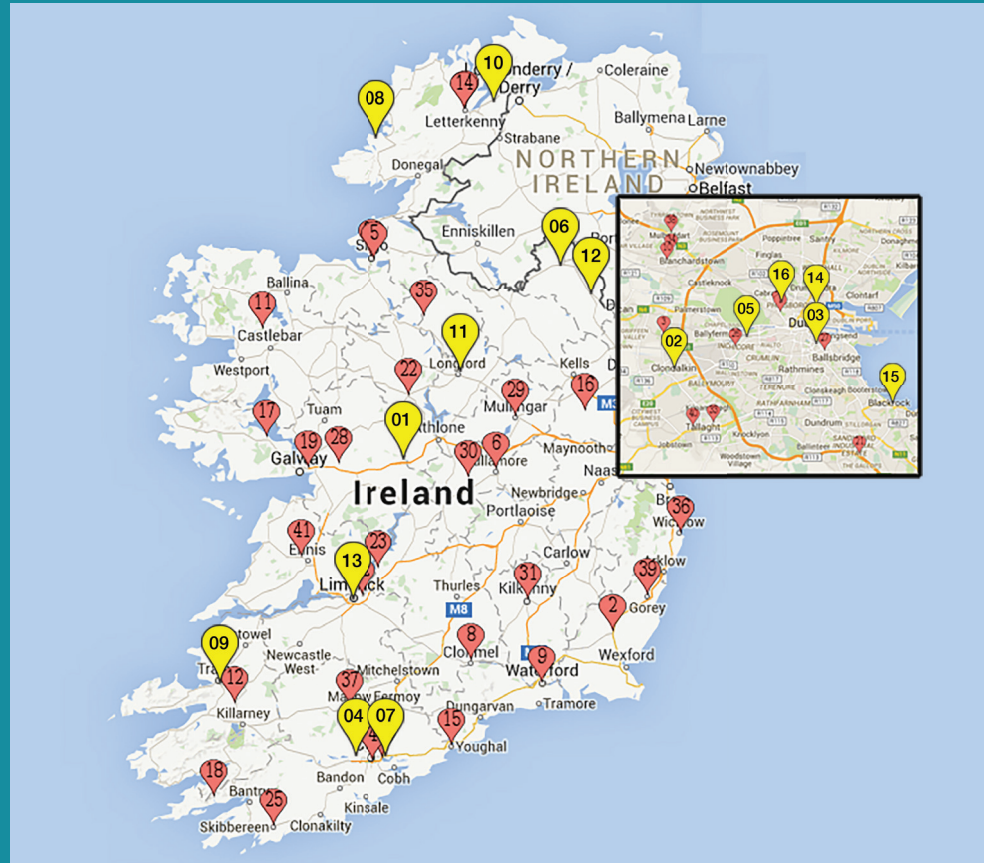


# Map of PSI Projects

## The Background to PSI

- ▶ The Parenting Support Initiative (PSI) is a collaborative partnership between the Katharine Howard Foundation (KHF) and the Community Foundation of Ireland (CFI).
- ▶ The Initiative is a three year (2013-2016), strategic grants programme with a focus on children from birth to 3 years and their parents, with a particular emphasis on supporting parents in their parenting role. Some projects in the Initiative also support parents at the ante-natal stage.
- ▶ A joint fund totalling €600,000 has been allocated for this Initiative over the three year period.
- ▶ PSI was launched in September 2013 and over 200 applications were received. This response indicated a high level of the interest from a diverse range of organisations within the community, voluntary and statutory sectors. Out of the 200 applications, 16 core projects were awarded funding of €180,000 in 2014 (nationwide). Due to the high level of response and quality of applications a further €100,000 was allocated by KHF to 43 projects as once-off small grants in 2014.
- ▶ In March 2015, the 16 core projects began year two of implementation and delivery and a total amount of €186,500 has been approved for the second year of the Initiative with potential for further funding in year three.

## Objectives of PSI

- ▶ To strengthen prevention & early intervention supports for young children and families to achieve better health, wellbeing, and learning outcomes.
- ▶ To reinforce the developmental role of both community and national based services working directly with children from birth to 3 years and their parents (Children & Young People's Services Committees; Family Resource Centres & other Community based services).
- ▶ To strengthen the links between existing health and community based services to support a holistic approach to meeting the needs of infants and young children.
- ▶ To build and share the learning from initiatives such as the Prevention & Early Intervention Programme now known as the Area Based Childhood Programme, and the National Early Years Access Initiative (NEYAI).

## PSI Approach includes

- ▶ A partnership approach to strengthening early years services in supporting children and families.
- ▶ Operating within national strategies such as Better Outcomes Brighter Futures and Healthy Ireland.
- ▶ Providing learning opportunities for projects/programmes.
- ▶ Focusing on the importance of good implementation in the development and delivery of the projects.
